Property Tax Exemption for the Cold War Veteran -The Board can act on it or not act on it or act on it for the dollar amount and/or deny it or approve it. Supervisor read off the instructions. How does the eligible exemption work? The exemption reduces the assessment value of your primary residence before the tax rate is applied. The amount of the exemptions is equal to the amount of eligible funds used to purchase the home, generally up to the maximum of \$7,500. So basically it is up to us whether we are going to do it or not. I talked to Charley Lewis at real property and she is the one that gave me all this stuff and she said if we went with the recommended \$7,500 it basically wouldn't do much as far as the tax rate or tax base. I'm sure that you know if you lower someone's assessment someone else will have to pay more. Darin- It depends on how many people come forward that were Cold War Vereran's Darin, I propose \$7,500 with a Maximum of \$30,000 with a disability.

Supervisor-The last estimated cost to do across the river at the beach and up river to get the silt out was three and a half million. It did go to a vote here in Town, but it was shot down 2 to 1 because we would have to borrow the money to do it.
