

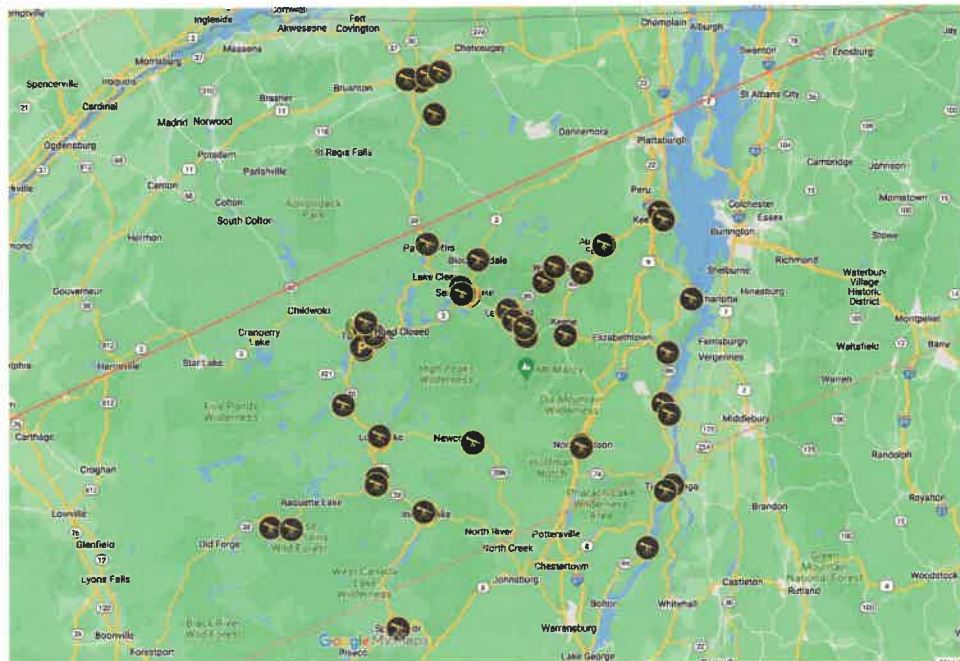


## Eclipse Update

With the April 8 total solar eclipse just around the corner, we wanted to share updates as well as some resources to prepare for and enjoy this extraordinary event.

### Where to Watch?

**What time will the eclipse take place in my Adirondack community?**

The eclipse will last for just under 2.5 hours. Where you are on the path of totality dictates exactly when and for how long you will experience full totality (when the moon completely covers the sun). Those closest to the center of the path will experience up to 3.5 minutes of totality. [View the timing chart](#) for our Adirondack communities.
